DIRECTORS' REPORT

The Directors of your Company take pleasure in presenting the standalone and consolidated un-audited condensed interim financial statements of the Company for the half year ended December 31, 2025 together with the Auditor's Review Report thereon.

During the period under review, the Company posted net sales revenue of Rupees 15,858 Million (2024: Rupees 13,143 Million) denoting an increase of 21% from the corresponding period of last year. The cost of sales was Rupees 13,293 Million (2024: Rupees 10,660 Million) bringing gross profit to Rupees 2,565 Million (2024: Rupees 2,483 Million). The gross profit margin was 16.17% vis-à-vis 18.89% of the corresponding period of last year. The Company's operational performance has improved in 2nd quarter as compared to 1st quarter of ongoing Financial Year. The bottom line showed a net profit after tax of Rupees 775 Million (2024: Rupees 614 Million) which yielded earnings per share of Rupees 7.75 (2024: Rupees 6.14 per share).

Moving forward, as previously communicated, the Company is prudently undertaking capital expenditure (CAPEX) initiatives across multiple strategic projects, positioning itself to enter a phase of accelerated and sustainable growth. These investments are aligned with the Company's long-term growth strategy and are expected to significantly enhance operational capacity, efficiency and overall profitability. The work on Biomass Power Plant establishment, being executed through the Company's wholly owned subsidiary i.e. M/s ICL Power (Pvt.) Limited, is well underway in accordance with the approved timelines and is expected to be operational during Financial Year 2026-27. The Board of Directors has sold Company's land measuring approximately 56 Kanals out of 66 Kanals, situated at Mouza Hassanabad, Barki Road, Lahore, Pakistan, as approved by shareholders in EOGM held on February 19, 2025. Details of transaction are available in relevant notes of the accounts. The sale of remaining 10 Kanals is in progress. The proceeds from the sale will be utilized to meet some of the equity portion of upcoming Biomass Power Plant Project of its wholly owned subsidiary.

In parallel, work on the Caustic Soda Flaker Plant is also advancing as planned which will further support the product portfolio and enhance value-added manufacturing capabilities. The project is likely to be commissioned by the end of FY 2025-26. The management is also considering investment in an associated Company / related party to the extent of (maximum) Rupees One Billion (Rupees 1,000,000,000) from time to time to seek opportunities in the business of providing services / supplies of Biomass collection, processing, storage, delivery and ancillary matters. An extra-ordinary general meeting will be held on March 27, 2026 to seek shareholders' approval for Investment in associated Company and election of directors.

Pakistan's economy has stabilized compared to its recent crisis period, with GDP growth, inflation easing, improved foreign exchange reserves and a narrowed fiscal deficit supported by IMF-backed reforms. The current account showed improvement and a relatively stable monetary policy stance has been adopted by the State Bank of Pakistan. However, growth remains modest, public debt is still high, private investment and FDI are weak.

The Management of your company is taking all suitable measures to plan and manage the challenges it is foreseeing in the future and continues to actively explore new markets, business opportunities and expansion avenues in addition to executing current projects and remains confident and optimistic regarding the Company's future prospects, supported by strategic investments and operational enhancements.

The Board is thankful to the valuable Members, Suppliers, Customers, Banks, and Government departments for their trust, confidence, persistent support, and patronage and would like to place on record its gratitude to all the Employees of the company for their contribution, dedication, and hard work.

ڈائریکٹر رپورٹ

آپ کی کمپنی کے ڈائریکٹر 31 دسمبر 2025ء کو اختتام پذیر ہونے والے نصف مالی سال کے غیر مربوط غیر پڑتال شدہ بین المدتی مختصر مالی گوشواروں کو آڈیٹرز کی جائزہ رپورٹ کے ساتھ پیش کرتے ہوئے خوشی محسوس کر رہے ہیں۔

زیر جائزہ مدت کے دوران، کمپنی کی فروخت گزشتہ سال کے اسی عرصہ کے مقابلے میں 21% فیصد اضافے کے ساتھ 15,858 ملین روپے (2024:13,143 ملین روپے) رہی۔ فروخت کی لاگت 13,293 ملین روپے (2024:10,660 ملین روپے) رہی جس سے 2,565 ملین روپے (2024:2,483 ملین روپے) خام منافع حاصل ہوا۔ خام منافع کا تناسب گزشتہ سال کے اسی عرصے کے 18.89 فیصد کے مقابلے میں 16.17 فیصد رہا۔ رواں مالی سال کی پہلی سہ ماہی کے مقابلے میں دوسری سہ ماہی میں کمپنی کی آپریشنل کارکردگی میں بہتری آئی ہے۔ ٹیکس کی ادائیگی کے بعد گوشوارے کی آخری سطر مبلغ 775 ملین روپے (2024:614 ملین روپے) کا منافع ظاہر کرتی ہے جس کے نتیجے میں فی حصص 7.75 روپے (2024:6.14 روپے فی حصص) کی آمدنی ہوئی۔

آگے بڑھتے ہوئے، جیسا کہ پہلے بتایا گیا ہے، کمپنی سمجھداری کے ساتھ متعدد اسٹریٹجک منصوبوں میں کیپٹل اخراجات (کیپیٹل) کے اقدامات کر رہی ہے، اور خود کو تیز رفتار اور پائیدار ترقی کے مرحلے میں داخل ہونے کی پوزیشن میں ہے۔ یہ سرمایہ کاری کمپنی کی طویل مدتی ترقی کی حکمت عملی کے مطابق ہے اور توقع ہے کہ اس سے آپریشنل صلاحیت، کارکردگی اور مجموعی منافع میں نمایاں اضافہ ہوگا۔ بائیو ماس پاور پلانٹ کے قیام کا کام، جو کمپنی کی مکمل ملکیتی ذیلی کمپنی یعنی M/s ICL Power (Pvt.) Limited کے ذریعے انجام دیا جا رہا ہے، منظور شدہ شیڈول کے مطابق اچھی طرح جاری ہے اور توقع کی جا رہی ہے کہ یہ مالی سال 2026-27 کے دوران کام کرنا شروع کر دے گا۔ بورڈ آف ڈائریکٹرز نے کمپنی کی 66 کنال میں سے تقریباً 56 کنال اراضی فروخت کر دی ہے، جو کہ موضع حسن آباد، برکی روڈ، لاہور، پاکستان میں واقع ہے، جیسا کہ 19 فروری 2025 کو منعقدہ EOGM میں شیئر ہولڈرز کی منظوری دی گئی تھی۔ لین دین کی تفصیلات اکاؤنٹس کے متعلقہ نوٹس میں دستیاب ہیں۔ باقی 10 کنال کی فروخت ابھی جاری ہے۔ فروخت سے حاصل ہونے والی آمدنی کو اس کی مکمل ملکیت والی ذیلی کمپنی کے آنے والے بائیو ماس پاور پلانٹ پر وجیکٹ کے کچھ ایکویٹی حصے کو پورا کرنے کے لیے استعمال کیا جائے گا۔

اسی دوران، کاسٹک سوڈا فلکیئر پلانٹ پر کام بھی منصوبے کے مطابق جاری ہے، جو مصنوعات کے پورٹ فولیو کی مزید معاونت کرے گا اور ویلیو ایڈڈ مینوفیکچرنگ کی صلاحیتوں کو بڑھائے گا۔ ممکنہ طور پر یہ منصوبہ مالی سال 2025-26 کے آخر تک شروع کر دیا جائے گا۔ انتظامیہ بائیو ماس کلیکیشن، پرسیدنگ، اسٹوریج، ڈیلیوری اور معاون امور کی خدمات / سپلائی فراہم کرنے کے کاروبار میں مواقع تلاش کرنے کے لیے وقتاً فوقتاً (زیادہ سے زیادہ) ایک ارب روپے (1,000,000,000 روپے) کی حد تک کسی وابستہ کمپنی / متعلقہ فریق میں سرمایہ کاری پر بھی غور کر رہی ہے۔ 27 مارچ 2026ء کو ایک غیر معمولی عام اجلاس منعقد کیا جائے گا جس میں متعلقہ کمپنی میں سرمایہ کاری اور ڈائریکٹرز کے انتخاب کے لیے شیئر ہولڈرز کی منظوری لی جائے گی۔

پاکستان کی معیشت حالیہ بحران کے مقابلے میں مستحکم ہوئی ہے، جس میں جی ڈی پی کی شرح نمو، مہنگائی میں کمی، بہتر بیرونی زرمبادلہ کے ذخائر اور آئی ایم ایف کی معاونت یافتہ اصلاحات کی مدد سے کم شدہ الماباتی خسارہ شامل ہے۔ موجودہ اکاؤنٹس میں بہتری دیکھنے کو ملی اور اسٹیٹ بینک آف پاکستان نے نسبتاً مستحکم الماباتی پالیسی اختیار کی ہے۔ تاہم، نمو ابھی بھی معتدل ہے، عوامی قرضہ اب بھی زیادہ ہے، نجی سرمایہ کاری اور برادراست غیر ملکی سرمایہ کاری کمزور ہیں۔

بورڈ قابل قدر حصص داران، سپلائرز، صارفین، بینکوں اور سرکاری محکموں کی جانب سے ان کے اعتماد، مسلسل تعاون اور سرپرستی پر شکر گزار ہے اور کمپنی کے تمام ملازمین کو ان کے تعاون، لگن اور محنت کے لیے شکر یہ ادا کرتا ہے۔

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REVIEW REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF ITTEHAD CHEMICALS LIMITED

Report on review of unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements

Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying unconsolidated condensed interim statement of financial position of ITTEHAD CHEMICALS LIMITED (the "Company") as at December 31, 2025 and the related unconsolidated condensed interim statement of profit or loss, unconsolidated condensed interim statement of comprehensive income, unconsolidated condensed interim statement of changes in equity and unconsolidated condensed interim statement of cash flows, and notes to the unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements for the six-month period then ended (here-in-after referred to as the "unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements"). Management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of these unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements in accordance with accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on these financial statements based on our review.

Scope of review

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements 2410, "Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity". A review of interim financial statements consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements is not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting.

Other Matter

Pursuant to the requirement of Section 237 (1) (b) of the Companies Act, 2017 only cumulative figures for the half year, presented in the second quarter accounts are subject to a limited scope review by the statutory auditors of the Company. Accordingly, the figures of the unconsolidated condensed interim statement of profit or loss and unconsolidated condensed interim statement of comprehensive income for the three months period ended December 31, 2025 and December 31, 2024 have not been reviewed by us.

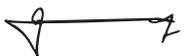

NOTES TO THE UNCONSOLIDATED CONDENSED INTERIM FINANCIAL STATEMENT (UNAUDITED) FOR THE HALF YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2025

1 LEGAL STATUS AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

Ittehad Chemicals Limited (the Company) was incorporated on September 28, 1991 under the repealed Companies Ordinance, 1984 (now Companies Act, 2017) and is listed on Pakistan Stock Exchange Limited. The Company was privatized on July 03, 1995. The Company is engaged in the business of manufacturing and selling caustic soda and other allied chemicals.

The Company holds 100% shares of Ittehad Salt Processing (Private) Limited (subsidiary company), which is a private limited company and incorporated in Pakistan under the Companies Act, 2017 on December 03, 2019. The subsidiary company is engaged in the business of exploring, operating, and working on mines and quarries. The registered office of subsidiary company is situated at 31-A, Tech Society, Canal Bank, Lahore. The Chief Executive of subsidiary company is Mr. Ahmed Mustafa.

The Company holds 100% shares of ICL Power (Private) Limited (subsidiary company), which is a private limited company incorporated in Pakistan under the Companies Act, 2017 on January 2, 2024, as company limited by shares. The Company is engaged in the business of generating and providing of electricity.

2 GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION AND ADDRESSES OF BUSINESS UNITS

3 BASIS OF PREPARATION

3.1 Statement of compliance

These unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting. The accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting.

International Accounting Standard (IAS) 34, Interim Financial Reporting, issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) as notified under the Companies Act, 2017;

Islamic Financial Accounting Standards (IFAS) issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Pakistan as notified under the Companies Act , 2017; and

Provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017.

Where provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017 differ with the requirements of IAS 34, the provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017 have been followed.

These unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements are unaudited but subject to the limited scope review by the auditors and is being submitted to the shareholders as required under section 237 of the Companies Act, 2017 and the listing regulations of the Pakistan Stock Exchange.

These unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information and disclosures required for full annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements of the Company as at and for the year ended June 30, 2025 which have been prepared in accordance with approved accounting standards as applicable in Pakistan. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the Company's financial position and performance since the last annual financial statements.

The comparative statement of financial position presented in these unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements have been extracted from the annual audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended June 30, 2025, whereas the comparative unconsolidated condensed interim statement of profit or loss, unconsolidated condensed interim statement of comprehensive income, unconsolidated condensed interim statement of cash flows and unconsolidated condensed interim statement of changes in equity are extracted from the unaudited unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements for the half year ended December 31, 2024.

3.2 Basis of measurement

These condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information and the disclosures required in the annual financial statements, and should be read in conjunction with annual audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended June 30, 2025.

3.3 Functional and presentation currency

These unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements have been presented in Pak Rupees, which is the functional and presentation currency of the Company.

4 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES AND JUDGEMENTS

The preparation of these unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

In preparing the unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements, the significant judgments made by the management in applying accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty are the same as those applied in the preparation of annual audited financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2025.

Provision in respect of Workers' Welfare Fund, Workers' Profit Participation Fund and taxation in these unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements are estimated based on management judgment and prevailing laws; these are subject to final adjustments in the annual audited financial statements.

5 MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICY INFORMATION

5.1 The accounting policies adopted and methods of computation followed in the preparation of these unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements are same as those for the preceding annual financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2025.

5.2 Changes in accounting standards, interpretations and amendments to published accounting and reporting standards

5.2.1 Amendments to published accounting and reporting standards which became effective during the period:

There were certain amendments to accounting and reporting standards which became mandatory for the Company during the period. However, the amendments did not have any significant impact on the financial reporting of the Company and, therefore, have not been disclosed in these unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements.

5.2.2 Amendments to published accounting and reporting standards that are not yet effective:

There are certain amendments to the accounting and reporting standards that will be mandatory for the Company's annual accounting periods beginning on or after January 01, 2026. However, these amendments will not have any significant impact on the financial reporting of the Company and, therefore, have not been disclosed in these unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements.

The Honorable Sindh High Court has granted a stay for recovery of arrears and matter is pending for adjudication. There is an aggregate differential of Rs. 352.920 million which is subjudice and that will be remain as provision until the matter is settled.

Further, there is an aggregate differential of Rs. 170.291 million between provision as per books of account and liability based on monthly instalment billed by SNGPL for unpaid portion of Cess levied through GIDC Act, 2011 and GIDC Ordinance, 2014, which is not recognized by the Company based on the advice of its legal expert as per their view it will not be collectable as per GIDC Act, 2015.

DIRECTORS' REPORT ON THE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The Directors take pleasure in presenting their report on the consolidated un-audited condensed interim financial statements of Ittehad Chemicals Limited (“The Holding Company”) and its wholly owned subsidiary companies, “Ittehad Salt Processing (Pvt.) Limited” (the “ISPPL”) and “ICL Power (Pvt.) Limited” (the “IPPL”) for the half year ended December 31, 2025.

Ittehad Salt Processing (Private) Limited (“ISPPL”) was established in accordance with the provisions of the Companies Act, 2017, as a company limited by shares, incorporated on December 3, 2019, in Pakistan. The company's registered office is located in Lahore, Punjab. ISPPL, as a wholly owned subsidiary of M/s Ittehad Chemicals Limited, is primarily focused on exploring opportunities in rock salt mining, ensuring full compliance with all applicable legal requirements. Presently, the ISPPL has filed an appeal at the appropriate Forum against the decision of Mines & Minerals Department, Punjab wherein the Department declined to award Mining Lease to the Company due to non-issuance of NOC by the Forest Department.

ICL Power (Private) Limited (“IPL”) was incorporated in Pakistan as a company limited by shares on January 2, 2024 under the Companies Act, 2017. The registered office of the Company is situated in Lahore, Punjab. The main objective of this wholly owned subsidiary is to carry out all or any of the businesses of generating, purchasing, importing, transforming, converting, distributing, supplying, exporting and dealing in electricity, in Pakistan or elsewhere in the world subject to the applicable laws. The wholly owned subsidiary is actively engaged in establishing a Biomass Power Plant, with construction work currently progressing at full pace. This project is expected to enhance long-term profitability and reinforce operational sustainability.

The Consolidated Financial Statements showed Earnings per share Rs. 7.26 (2024: Rs. 6.14 per share) for the period ended December 31, 2025.

Adequate internal financial controls are in place and Management ensures complete and satisfactory implementation of the same. The Management is optimistic about future growth and healthy returns after obtaining the Mining license from Punjab Mines & Minerals Department and regulatory approvals for the Biomass Power Plant establishment.

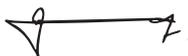

NOTES TO THE CONSOLIDATED CONDENSED INTERIM FINANCIAL STATEMENT (UNAUDITED) FOR THE HALF YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2025

1 LEGAL STATUS AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

The group comprises of Ittehad Chemicals Limited (Parent/holding Company) (ICL), Ittehad Salt Processing (Private) Limited (Subsidiary Company) (ISPL) and ICL Power (Private) Limited (Subsidiary Company) (IPL). The Parent Company and the subsidiary companies are collectively referred to as "the Group".

1.1 Status of the Parent Company

Ittehad Chemicals Limited (the Holding Company) was incorporated on September 28, 1991 under the repealed Companies Ordinance, 1984 (now Companies Act, 2017) and is listed on Pakistan Stock Exchange Limited. The Group was privatised on July 03, 1995. The Group is engaged in the business of manufacturing and selling caustic soda and other allied chemicals.

The Holding Company holds 100% shares of Ittehad Salt Processing (Private) Limited (subsidiary company), which is a private limited company and incorporated in Pakistan under the Companies Act, 2017 on December 03, 2019, as company limited by shares. The subsidiary company is engaged in the business of exploring, operating, and working on mines and quarries. The Chief Executive of subsidiary company is Mr. Ahmed Mustafa.

The Holding Company holds 100% shares of ICL Power (Private) Limited (subsidiary company), which is a private limited company and incorporated in Pakistan under the Companies Act, 2017 on January 2, 2024, as company limited by shares. The subsidiary company is engaged in the business of generating and providing of electricity. The Chief Executive of subsidiary company is Waqas Siddiq Khatri.

1.2 Basis of consolidation

These Consolidated financial statements comprise the financial statements of the Holding Company and its Subsidiary Companies as at December 31, 2025 (together referred to as "the Group").

A Company is a subsidiary, if an entity (the Holding Company) directly or indirectly controls, beneficially owns or holds more than fifty percent of its voting securities or otherwise has power to elect and appoint more than fifty percent of its directors.

Subsidiary is consolidated from the date on which the Holding Company obtains control, and continue to be consolidated until the date when such control ceases. The effective date of consolidation was May 26, 2021.

The financial statements of the subsidiaries is prepared for the same reporting period as the Holding/parent Company, using consistent accounting policies.

All inter-company balances, transactions and unrealized gains and losses resulting from inter-company transactions and dividends are eliminated in full.

The assets, liabilities, income and expenses of subsidiary company are consolidated on a line by line basis and carrying value of investments held by the Holding Company is eliminated against the subsidiary company's shareholders' equity in the consolidated financial statements.

2 GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION AND ADDRESSES OF BUSINESS UNITS

The geographical locations and addresses of the Group's business units, including production facilities are as under:

2.1 Holding company

The registered office of ICL is situated at 39, Empress Road, Lahore. The manufacturing facility of the Group is located at G.T Road Kala Shah Kaku District Sheikhpura and regional offices are located as follows:

3 BASIS OF PREPARATION

3.1 Statement of compliance

These consolidated condensed interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting. The accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting.

International Accounting Standard (IAS) 34, Interim Financial Reporting, issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) as notified under the Companies Act, 2017;

Islamic Financial Accounting Standards (IFAS) issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Pakistan as notified under the Companies Act, 2017; and

Provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017.

Where provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017 differ with the requirements of IAS 34, the provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017 have been followed.

These consolidated condensed interim financial statements are unaudited and is being submitted to the shareholders as required under section 237 of the Companies Act, 2017 and the listing regulations of the Pakistan Stock Exchange.

These consolidated condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information and disclosures required for full annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements of the Company as at and for the year ended June 30, 2025 which have been prepared in accordance with approved accounting standards as applicable in Pakistan. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the Company's financial position and performance since the last annual financial statements.

The comparative statement of financial position presented in these consolidated condensed interim financial statements have been extracted from the annual audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended June 30, 2025, whereas the comparative consolidated condensed interim statement of profit or loss, consolidated condensed interim statement of comprehensive income, consolidated condensed interim statement of cash flows and consolidated condensed interim statement of changes in equity are extracted from the unaudited consolidated condensed interim financial statements for the half year ended December 31, 2024.

3.2 Basis of measurement

These consolidated condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information and the disclosures required in the annual financial statements, and should be read in conjunction with annual audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended June 30, 2025.

3.3 Functional and presentation currency

These consolidated condensed interim financial statements have been presented in Pak Rupees, which is the functional and presentation currency of the Company.

4 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES AND JUDGEMENTS

The preparation of these consolidated condensed interim financial statements requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

In preparing the consolidated condensed interim financial statements, the significant judgments made by the management in applying accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty are the same as those applied in the preparation of annual audited financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2025.

Provision in respect of Workers' Welfare Fund, Workers' Profit Participation Fund and taxation in these unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements are estimated based on management judgment and prevailing laws; these are subject to final adjustments in the annual audited financial statements.

5 MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICY INFORMATION

5.1 The accounting policies adopted and methods of computation followed in the preparation of these unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements are same as those for the preceding annual financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2025.

5.2 Changes in accounting standards, interpretations and amendments to published accounting and reporting standards

5.2.1 Amendments to published accounting and reporting standards which became effective during the period:

There were certain amendments to accounting and reporting standards which became mandatory for the Company during the period. However, the amendments did not have any significant impact on the financial reporting of the Company and, therefore, have not been disclosed in these unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements.

5.2.2 Amendments to published accounting and reporting standards that are not yet effective:

There are certain amendments to the accounting and reporting standards that will be mandatory for the Company's annual accounting periods beginning on or after January 01, 2026. However, these amendments will not have any significant impact on the financial reporting of the Company and, therefore, have not been disclosed in these unconsolidated condensed interim financial statements.

Further, there is an aggregate differential of Rs. 170.291 million between provision as per books of account and liability based on monthly instalment billed by SNGPL for unpaid portion of Cess levied through GIDC Act, 2011 and GIDC Ordinance, 2014, which is not recognized by the Company based on the advice of its legal expert as per their view it will not be collectable as per GIDC Act, 2015.

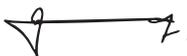
